

# Ontario Trillium Award Nomination Guide

## **Ontario Square and Round Dance Federation**

## Introduction

The Ontario Trillium Nomination Guide describes the two Ontario Trillium Awards and details nomination procedures and criteria for each award. A companion document (the Ontario Trillium Award Administrative Guide) provides direction to Board members and others regarding internal administration, consideration of nominations, and the presentation of an Ontario Trillium Award.

## History

The Ontario Square and Dance Federation established the **Trillium Merit Award** in 1985. The intention was to recognize dancers and leaders who had demonstrated excellence and dedication and who made outstanding achievements to advance square and/or round dancing in Ontario. The Federation presented the first Trillium Award in the spring of 1985.

In 1999, the Ontario Federation introduced a second Trillium Award, presenting the first **Trillium Long Service Award** in 2000. The Ontario Federation now provides two awards:

The <u>Trillium Merit Award</u> recognizes significant contributions to the square and/or round dance community in Ontario beyond the scope of the normal and regular activities of a dancer or leader.

The <u>Trillium Long Service Award</u> recognizes individuals who have devoted many years of faithful service to the square and/or round dance community in Ontario.

#### **Nomination Procedure**

- 1) a) To submit a nomination, individuals or clubs do so through their regional association **not directly to the Federation**.
  - b) Each year, each regional association may submit up to 2 nominations for a Trillium Merit Award and up to 2 nominations for a Trillium Long Service Award.
  - c) The applicable nomination form is to be used for each nomination. Nomination forms are available at: <a href="https://squaredance.on.ca/trillium-awards/">https://squaredance.on.ca/trillium-awards/</a>
  - d) Nominations require the support of the appropriate regional association. The association must confirm the nominee's membership status with the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society.
  - e) Completed nomination forms must be sent to the Federation Secretary to arrive by 30 April of the year the award is to be presented.
  - f) The Ontario Federation Board will return to the association, any nomination that does not appear to be complete or sufficiently detailed.

## **Eligibility – for either Trillium Award**

- 2) a) Individuals or couples are eligible for nomination, EXCEPT for:
  - individuals who have already received an award, and
  - couples in which one or both partners have already received an award.
  - b) Nominees must be dancers or leaders involved in square and/or round dancing.
  - c) A significant amount of a nominee's dancing experience must have been in Ontario.
  - d) Experience and achievements outside of Ontario will be considered.
  - e) Nominees may be currently active or retired from dancing.
  - f) Nominees who are current dancers or leaders must be members of the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society.
  - g) Nominations will be accepted for posthumous awards.
  - h) Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated again in a subsequent year.

#### **Trillium Long Service Award**

- 3) a) Nominees for a Trillium Long Service Award must have:
  - been involved with square and/or round dancing for at least 20 years. Separate periods of time and dancing outside of Ontario can be used to meet the 20-year requirement,
  - ii) served in leadership capacities at the club level, and
  - iii) helped recruit dancers and/or leaders,
  - b) Consideration will also be given to volunteer participation in:
    - i) more than one style of dancing,
    - ii) multiple clubs,
    - iii) promoting dancing to the general public, and
    - iv) advancing square and/or round dancing in Ontario.

#### **Trillium Merit Award**

- 4) a) Nominees for a Trillium Merit Award must have:
  - i) been involved with square and/or round dancing for at least 5 years;
  - ii) made a significant contribution to dancing in Ontario;
  - iii) served in leadership capacities at the club level;
  - iv) served as an executive or committee member at the regional, provincial, and/or national level;
  - v) participated in dancer and/or leader recruitment events;
  - vi) supported dancer and/or leader development through mentoring, serving as an angel, and/or serving in leaders' clinics;
  - vii) participated in non-club events such as conventions and dance events outside of their own home area: and
  - viii)volunteered time and effort to contribute beyond the minimum level expected of most dancers or leaders.
  - b) Consideration will also be given to volunteer participation in:
    - i) more than one style of dancing,
    - ii) multiple clubs,
    - iii) any other activities to advance square and/or round dancing in Ontario.

#### **Awards**

- 5) The physical awards provided to award winners include:
  - a) a quality parchment scroll,
  - b) a wooden wall plaque, and
  - c) selected jewellery.

## Presentation

- 6) a) Award presentations will be made at a time and location jointly agreed upon by the regional association and the recipient.
  - b) Whenever possible a representative of the Ontario Federation and the regional association will participate in the presentation.
  - c) When regional or provincial presenters cannot participate, the presentations may be conducted at the club level.
